6 Things you can do to prepare for wildfire season!

ReachWell

Download the app to get updates from EC Alert. Bookmark ECEmergency.org for information on current emergency events.

Pack a Go-Bag

Medications, documents, water, clothing – ready so you can leave in minutes, not hours (get details on what to pack on reverse side of brochure).

Defensible Space

Fire-Free-Five: a fire-foot-wide zone of non-combustible landscaping around all buildings. Clearing a 5-foot noncombustible zone immediately around your home helps protect it from landing embers.

Home Maintenance

Clean gutters, repair vents with fine mesh, remove debris from decks – common ignition points.
